STATEMENTS OF FINANCIAL INTERESTS FILED BY CANDIDATES

To determine if a candidate has filed a Statement of Financial Interests go to <https://nadc-e.nebraska.gov> and do the following:

1. At the top of the page, click on the Search tab
2. On the drop down, click on Statements of Financial Interests (C-1)
3. Next to Filing Year click on 2021
4. Type the last name of the candidate in the Last Name box
5. Skip down to the Search/Reset boxes and click on Search

A list of all filers with that last name will be displayed by last name, first name and date of filing. If you see the name you are seeking, you may click on View to see the filing. If the name of the candidate you are seeking does not appear, that person has not filed a statement for 2021. If no names appear, then no one with that last name has filed a statement for 2021.

Things to know about Statements of Financial Interests:

- Item 5 on the form shows the period covered.
- A candidate filing in January 2022 or later to appear on the 2022 ballot must file a Statement of Financial Interests covering 2021.

Statements of Financial Interests are **due on or before March 1, 2022**. There is a statutory grace period which extends the deadline to March 7, 2022.
